Time: 8:30am (9:00am start) to 4:30pm. The Kalamunda Hotel will be open if you wish to socialise afterwards.

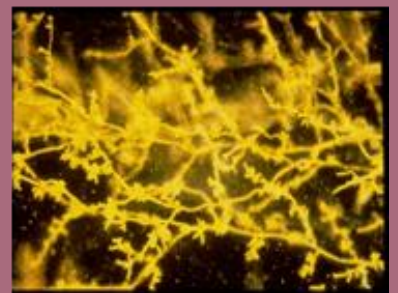
Registration: Registration is fully online at www.dieback.info. The cost is \$80 for concession and \$100 full price which can be paid online when you register. The price does not include GST.
